COVID REMINDERS

COVID IS ON THE RISE..AGAIN!

- Monitor our absenteeism rate for faculty/staff/students and report to Archdiocese if reaches or exceeds 10%.
- Archdiocese & LMDPH will determine if additional prevention measures necessary – such as universal masking up to class or school closure.

COVID REMINDERS

Keep your daughter at home if she is feeling sick.

If COVID positive – Isolate & notify our school nurse.

- Return Day 6 if she is symptom free but must wear a mask for full 10 days
- If symptoms don't resolve by Day 5 must isolate for full 10 days and return
 Day 11
- Day 0 is the first day experience symptoms

ATTIRE & ATTENDANCE: BACK TO BASICS

Please consult the Student-Parent Handbook for all the details

- **ATTIRE:** Please help us with our uniform policies especially skirt length.
- **ATTENDANCE:** Attendance and being on time much bigger deal in high school than in elementary/middle school
 - Consequences of too many absences and too many tardies spelled out in student-parent handbook
- Excused for illness, death in the family, and driver's testing
- Absences, early dismissals, and late arrivals require a doctor's note/medical statement to be excused and work can be made up for 100% credit
- Unexcused for family trips, vacations,—contact I-2 weeks in advance if you think there could be mitigating circumstances
 - Unexcused absence: 50% credit for work completed and submitted

Know that I am here to support you and your child in every way possible. I look forward to being a team with you and appreciate your support!






- Trust your parenting! Look at the wonderful job you've done.


- Individual check in with every student each semester.


2018- "Freshman Year"
