#### **APPLICATION TRENDS – WHAT ARE WE SEEING?**

- More applications driving up selectivity,
   particularly out of state, public universities
  - I.e., Fall 2024, UT received 49,248 applications by the November 1<sup>st</sup> Early Action deadline, a 28% increase and 10,774 more applications compared to November 2022.
- More deferrals, denials, and waitlists

#### **COLLEGE ADMISSION TRENDS**

- The return of the ACT (self-reporting on rise)
- Early deadlines
- Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR)

#### **CLASS OF 2024 APPLICATIONS**

- Class of 210 students
- Submitted 900+ applications
- Admitted to 172 different colleges and universities
- Average number of applications submitted:4.3 I

#### OTHER COLLEGETRENDS – WHAT ARE WE SEEING?

- Housing urgency (i.e., UK and Ole Miss)
  - Number admitted v. space available?
- Increased emphasis on "fit" (i.e., supplemental questions/essays)
- Some schools using demonstrated interest
- A "holistic" approach to admissions
- College costs rising. Scholarships and financial aid? Not so much.

- Tests Required, Test Preferred, or Strongly Recommended: students must take and submit test scores
- **Test Optional:** Test scores are not required for a student to be admitted. Students have the choice to send scores if they have them, but they will not be penalized if they choose not to include test scores as part of their application.
- **Test Flexible**: Colleges or universities allow students to choose which type of test (or tests) they'd like to submit with their application (i.e., ACT, SAT, AP)
- **Test Blind:** Test scores will not be considered as part of the application evaluation **Other factors:** 
  - Super-scoring
  - When to send/not send (Middle 50%)

#### **STANDARDIZED TESTING**

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

- 95% of scholarships students receive come from the colleges/universities where they were admitted
  - In-state vs. out of state
  - Public vs. Private
  - Some schools are transparent about scholarship awards, others are not (i.e., UK)
- 5% "Outside" scholarships from agencies, places of employment
  - Many outside scholarship opportunities emailed to seniors and included on 'College & Career' senior OneNote
  - National vs. Local scholarships
  - Do not pay for scholarship searches
  - Timing is typically second semester when motivation is lower
