Help me to be a guide, a comforter, a model, and a companion along the way. Let me always realize that she is a precious and unique gift in my life.


Help me to praise and encourage at least as much as I correct and discipline. Be with me as I try to help her become who You created her to be.



SB 181-ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION

- SB 181 went into affect this summer
- Applies to public schools the Archdiocese has urged all Catholic Schools to adopt policies that safeguard students and provide guidance to employees on acceptable means of traceable communication.
- Places restrictions on employees engaging with students one on one through non-traceable means which includes phone call, text, or social media.

ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION CONTINUED...

- AHS has adopted 2 platforms to communicate with students:
 - Email
 - Group Me (or Teamsnap for athletics)
 - All students/parents are included in the Group Me/Team Snap along with an administrator
 - No private communications are permitted
- Both platforms are traceable and accessible to administration

ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS CONTINUED....

Two Exceptions:

- Related to the Student
- Parental Consent
 - Consent form completed by the Parent and submitted to the President to maintain on file
 - Can be revoked in writing at any time with notice to the President





TEXTBOOK RETURN CONDITIONS

- Water Damage If a book has been dropped in a puddle, had water spilled on it, or accidentally left outside, our warehouse will not be able to accept it back. Any water damage to a product can mold other products in our warehouse and will be immediately recycled.
- **Duct Tape** If the binding of your product is being held together by duct tape, or if there is tape on the cover of the book, our warehouse will not accept the return.
- **Highlights** Students are permitted to highlight and mark in their books! We only ask that it is not excessive. If more than a third of the book is written in and highlighted, our warehouse will not accept it back.
- We also will not accept books in which profanity or graphic images have been added in by the student.
- If your daughter's book is lost or deemed unacceptable to be returned to eCampus, the family will be billed for the cost of the text.




